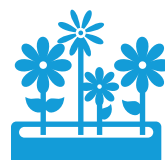

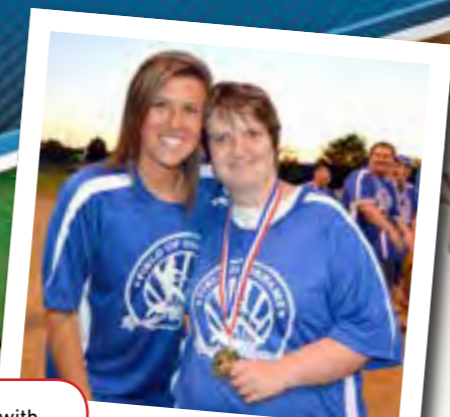

Health Care Day Continues to Grow and Make a Difference

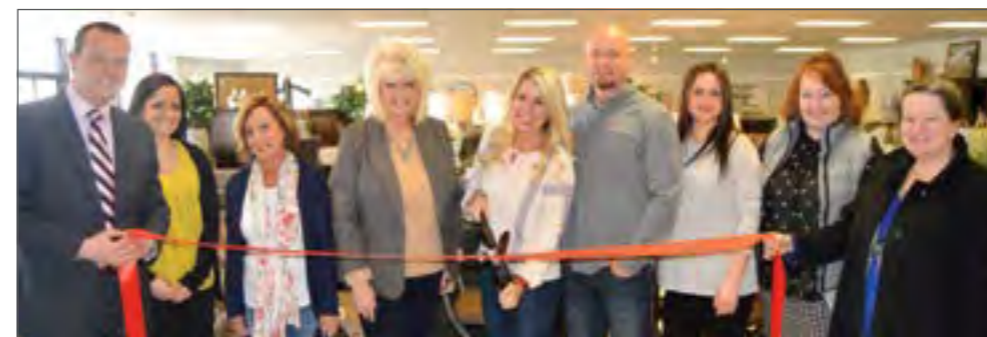
